To provide for a review of sanctions with respect to Hong
Kong.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REVIEW OF SANCTIONS WITH RESPECT TO**
4 **HONG KONG.**

5 (a) DETERMINATION WITH RESPECT TO IMPOSITION
6 OF SANCTIONS.—Not later than 180 days after the date
7 of the enactment of this Act, the President shall submit
8 to the appropriate congressional committees a determina-
9 tion, including a detailed justification, of whether any per-

1 son listed in subsection (b) meets the criteria for the im-
2 position of sanctions pursuant to—

3 (1) section 1263(b) of the Global Magnitsky
4 Human Rights Accountability Act (22 U.S.C.
5 10102(b));

6 (2) Executive Order 13818 (50 U.S.C. 1701
7 note; relating to blocking the property of persons in-
8 volved in serious human rights abuse or corruption);

9 (3) section 7 of the Hong Kong Human Rights
10 and Democracy Act of 2019 (22 U.S.C. 5701 note;
11 Public Law 116–76);

12 (4) section 6 of the Hong Kong Autonomy Act
13 (22 U.S.C. 5701 note; Public Law 116–149); or
